
State of Maryland

Wes Moore is the 63rd Governor of the state of Maryland. He is Maryland's first Black Governor in the state's 246-year history, and is just the third African American elected Governor in the history of the United States.

Born in Takoma Park, Maryland, on October 15, 1978, to Joy and Westley Moore, Moore's life took a tragic turn when his father died of a rare, but treatable virus when he was just three years old. After his father's death, his family moved to the Bronx to live with Moore's grandparents before returning to Maryland at age 14.

Moore is a proud graduate of Valley Forge Military Academy and College, where he received an Associate's degree in 1998, and was commissioned as a second lieutenant in the U.S. Army. Afterward, he went on to earn his Bachelor's in

international relations and economics at Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, where he graduated Phi Beta Kappa.



In 2005, Moore deployed to Afghanistan as a lieutenant with the 82nd Airborne Division, leading soldiers in combat. Immediately upon returning home, Moore served as a White House Fellow, advising on issues of national security and international relations.

In 2010, Moore wrote "The Other Wes Moore," a story about the fragile nature of opportunity in America, which became a perennial New York Times bestseller. He went on to write other best-selling books that reflect on issues of race, equity, and opportunity, including his latest book "Five Days," which tells the story of Baltimore in the days that followed the death of Freddie Gray in 2015.

Moore built and launched a Baltimore-based business called BridgeEdU, which reinvented freshman year of college for underserved students to increase their likelihood of long-term success. BridgeEdu was acquired by the Brooklyn-based student financial success platform, Edquity, in 2018.

It was Moore's commitment to taking on our toughest challenges that brought him to the Robin Hood Foundation, where he served for four years as CEO. During his tenure, the Robin Hood Foundation distributed over \$600 million toward lifting families out of poverty, including here in Maryland.

While the Robin Hood Foundation is headquartered in New York City, Wes and his family never moved from their home in Baltimore. Moore has also worked in finance with Deutsche Bank in London and with Citigroup in New York. Moore and his wife, First Lady Dawn Flythe Moore, have two children – Mia and James – and a dog, Tucker Balti.

Creating One Maryland: An Event That Sparked a New Beginning

In the late 2000s and early 2010s, Maryland's technology ecosystem was a collection of promising startups, research institutions and corporate innovators, but it lacked a central hub to bring them together. The state's entrepreneurial landscape was fragmented, with pockets of innovation scattered across different regions, often disconnected from one another.

Recognizing this disconnect, John Wasilisin, TEDCO's vice president at the time, observed the development of technology and entrepreneurship in other states. While visiting Austin, Texas, inspiration struck.

A spark of inspiration

Wasilisin recalled the experience, explaining that Maryland seemed to be "missing something." The environment in Austin reflected a level of collaboration that Maryland had yet to achieve. In Austin, he found a community of people that recognized the benefits of healthy competition – that, with "more people rowing in the same direction, the rising tide helps everyone."

This observation led him to consider everything Maryland had to offer – from federal laboratories to research universities to venture capital investors – and how he could help enable the collaborative environment that would spur innovation and growth. His brainstorming led him to a solution that required TEDCO to be the host.

Upon his return, he brought the idea to his staff, and the feedback was nothing short of positive, bringing the first Entrepreneur Expointo focus.

The first connection

Wasilisin's vision was simple: "I want a gathering of everyone who's got some kind of skin in the Maryland innovation ecosystem. The team all had a role and they all had complemented each other. I

was very fortunate, because there was no way I could do everything myself. I was excited to lead an amazing staff of people who were



dedicated to this, and we were all moving in the same direction."

By 2011, a unified platform for Maryland's entrepreneurial community was created through a modest gathering around the theme of "Harnessing the Power of Innovation in Maryland." This inaugural event marked a significant step forward, bridging the gaps between different sectors and regions; later, it was renamed to the "Entrepreneur Expo" ("Expo").

"I knew we were onto something because people were saying 'when's the next one?" recalled Wasilisin. "All these different people were really energized about it, and they were comfortable with TEDCO being the facilitator of it because we weren't taking all the credit and we weren't aligned with any one particular entity. I think it allowed us to be seen as impartial and that was very important."

Progressing towards community

Each consecutive year, the Expo has grown exponentially, attracting hundreds of attendees from across the state and beyond.

Through teamwork, the event has become a cornerstone of Maryland's innovation ecosystem, fostering connections, inspiring

entrepreneurs and driving economic growth.

With each successful iteration, the expectations for the event kept climbing. To meet this growing demand, TEDCO would gather information from attendees post event. Armed with feedback and knowledge, the event met the growing expectations.

"Every year, the program got bigger; more and more speakers were coming to us instead of us having to chase them," Wasilisin proudly noted. "The people came to get energized, and they walked out saying, You know what? Maybe I can do this.' They heard how hard it was for the successful entrepreneurs and would think 'I'm going through that same thing, but I shouldn't give up."

Creating One Maryland

As the event continued playing a pivotal role in strengthening Maryland's technology and life science ecosystem, TEDCO made sure to prioritize access to the event; people from all regions could attend by funding bus travel to bring attendees from Western Maryland and the Eastern Shore.

"Technology knows no boundaries," said Wasilisin, "I've seen some of the coolest technology from people on the Eastern Shore, in western Maryland and in southern Maryland. These entrepreneurs complemented the research universities and the federal labs in the metro regions of Maryland."

Having statewide representation allowed Expo to bridge the gap between academia and industry. By bringing together researchers, students, and faculty with entrepreneurs and investors, the event has fostered relationships that have led to the commercialization of new technologies.

Wasilisin witnessed such collaboration firsthand, describing the phenomenon as an accomplishment he "never thought [he'd] see" with how various entities typically worked.

Always looking forward, the occasion played a crucial role in inspiring the next generation of innovators, allowing seasoned leaders to remember a time when they were the entrepreneurs, working towards a dream.

By showcasing the success stories of Maryland-based companies, young innovators were encouraged to pursue their entrepreneurial dreams.

Wasilisin recalls how successful businesspeople spoke at Expo sessions, then gave their time to younger entrepreneurs who were early in their journeys: "They remembered when they were in their other shoes...they really took the time to talk to them and actually sat down and had a coffee. I knew how important it was to the entrepreneur."

The final countdown

The event continued to grow, building communities and reaching the pinnacle of its goal by receiving recognition from Maryland's economic development community: the event received the Economic Development Marketing Award from The Maryland Economic Development Association (MEDA) in 2020.

"The Entrepreneur Expo was created to enable a community of collaboration across the state that matched John's vision; we've surpassed that," said current TEDCO CEO Troy LeMaile-Stovall. "We now have an entrepreneurial ecosystem that other states strive for."

After 10 events, it was clear that the event fulfilled its purpose, leading the organization to announce the final event of the series. However, even with the end in sight, one important message remains—the opportunities for One Maryland remain infinite.

"While it's bittersweet to see the event come to an end, we are excited to open up opportunities, allow others to shine and TEDCO the chance to support the ecosystem in other ways," said Tammi Thomas, TEDCO's Chief Development and Marketing Officer. "Each day needs a sunset for another sunrise to bring another day of joy and opportunities to the table; similarly, while the Expo series is ending, One Maryland remains."

Cultural change is often the hardest part of building a thriving innovation ecosystem, especially within academic research environments. But, when one translational project succeeds, it can flip a switch. Faculty start thinking differently. Graduate students explore entrepreneurship. Departments reimagine success. This panel explores the 'innovation flywheel' effect: how early wins in commercialization can generate institutional momentum, shift academic mindsets, and lay the foundation for sustainable tech-based economic development. Attendees will gain practical insight into creating momentum within academic ecosystems even when starting small.
